

Download Qlikview For Developers Cookbook

One of the cool things about Qlik Sense Server is the ability to be far more granular as to what you give particular users access to do in different areas. As I touched upon in the first part of my series of posts on Dates in QlikView, one of the first things developers learn about QlikView is that there are no traditional data types. What they sometimes don't learn is that instead QlikView stores field data as dual values containing both a string, which is used for displaying to the user, and a numerical value used for sorting and calculations.
