Although it is most famous for its tilt, the tower is actually a great example of late Italian Romanesque architecture. It was designed by Bonnano Pisano and ground was broke in 1173. Construction of the tower would occur in three stages over 199 years until its completion in 1372. An architectural style that originated in Medieval Europe, Romanesque Architecture is typified by its semi-circular arches that deviate from the pointed arches of Gothic architecture. Because works exhibiting Romanesque architecture remain across the European continent, this type of architecture is widely considered as the first pan-European architectural style since Imperial Roman Architecture.
